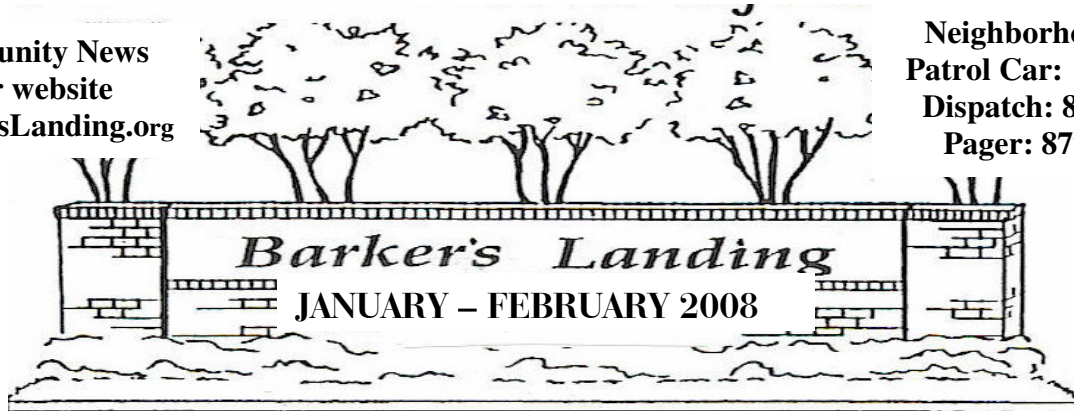

MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER MEETING OF THE BOARD
November 19, 2007

The Board of Directors of the Barkers Landing Homeowners Association, Inc. (BLHOA) met for the scheduled meeting at 3:00 pm on November 19, 2007 at the office of Planned Community Management, Inc. The meeting was called to order by Don Fleck, President, at 3:00 pm.

Present: Don Fleck Ted Winzeler
 Noel Rando Suzanne Walsh
 Steve Shurn

Also present were Charlie Burckle of the Architectural Control Committee, Dottie Frank of the Barkers Landing Community Club, Marjorie Bowstrom of the Barker Court HOA, Judy Deeds, and Diane Lahey, homeowners and Bob Eaton, representing Planned Community Management, Inc.

The minutes of the September 27, 2007 meeting of the Board were presented and after motion made, seconded and approved, it was

RESOLVED: to approve the minutes as amended of the September 27, 2007 meeting of the Board of Directors of the BLHOA.

The minutes of the October 19, 2007 meeting of the Board were presented and after motion made, seconded and approved, it was

RESOLVED: to approve the minutes, with amendments presented by Suzanne Walsh, of the October 19, 2007 meeting of the Board of Directors of the BLHOA.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE (Suzanne Walsh reporting)

Ms. Walsh inquired about the No Soliciting sign ordered for the entry and Bob Eaton stated that the item had been reordered.

Ms. Walsh reported that Komp needs to reimburse the Association for one color planting for the year. She noted the need for further work on the Sandy Port Island and after motion made, seconded and approved, it was

RESOLVED: to allow expenditures of \$1750 plus taxes for the installation of knockout roses and a little gem magnolia tree on the Sandy Port Island.

Ms. Walsh reported that the landscaper would be installing winter color of dianthus, snapdragon with white alyssum and blue lobelia border during the upcoming week. She also reported that she had solicited a bid on the painting of the Memorial Wall of \$6500 from the company of French Painting and Decorating. She asked that PCMI follow up on the letter to the homeowner requesting that he repair the cracks in the Memorial wall on the west side of the entry.

Noel Rando reported that thieves had stolen the copper backflow valve on the entry landscaping and noted that Komp had recommended placement of a security "cage" over the valve when replaced; after motion made, seconded and approved, it was

RESOLVED: to allow expenditures of \$455 for a security cage for the entry backflow valve, once replaced. Shielding shrubbery will be considered at a later date.

The Board discussed the holiday lighting; after motion made, seconded and approved, it was

RESOLVED: to allow expenditures of \$2,567 to Komp for Holiday Lighting or expenditures of \$500 to Mr. Vickers pending ongoing ability to obtain liability insurance.

RECREATION CENTER (Ted Winzeler)

The pool walk through has been completed and after motion made, seconded and approved it was

RESOLVED: to allow expenditures of up to \$800 to repair Pump #1.

Also, Mr. Winzler reported that a quote is requested for high pressure sodium lamps for the pool lighting and a rebid is sought in the repair/replacement of the windscreens at the tennis courts.

In addition, the board discussed the 2008 pool contract with A-Beautiful Pools; after motion made, seconded and approved, it was

RESOLVED: to allow Ted Winzler to sign contract, up to the quoted rate of \$32,000 and to look into what types of discounts are available.

PATROL COMMITTEE (Noel Rando)

Noel Rando reported that he reset all lighting timers at the end of Daylight Savings Time. Also, the Houston Police Department was out twice during the month to issue citations to drivers not observing the stop sign at the corner of N. Barkers Landing and Hidden Harbor. Mr. Rando also reported that the patrol staff is now down to three officers.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE (Charlie Burckle)

Mr. Burckle reported that it has been very quiet in the community.

BP COMMITTEE (Charlie Burckle)

Mr. Burckle reported Ed Gorham has joined the committee. Also, the Interface Committee wrote a second letter to BP voicing their concerns regarding the possible development of a mid to high rise apartment project. BP received it and acknowledged some merit to parts of the letter. It will be forwarded to the project people.

BARKER'S LANDING COMMUNITY CLUB (Dottie Frank)

Ms. Frank reported that 43 new people joined the BLCC and 28 attended the recent meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT – (Steven Shurn)

Financial report shows that Association is over budget for the month but under budget for the year.

OLD BUSINESS

The BLCC has agreed to donate certain funds for the purchase and installation of the Play Station at the recreation center (“Donated Funds”). The Donated Funds are earmarked for the goods and services to be provided under the following contracts/quotes with Advantage Playground Systems: Q742 (“Phase 1”); Q743 (“Phase 2”)’ Q744 (“Phase 3”); Q745 (“Phase 4”); and Q746 (“Phase 5”); (collectively the “Play Station”); and will donate \$500.00 to pay for the necessary sprinkler preparation work to be performed by Komp, which have been estimated to cost about \$450.. The colors of the Play Station shall be earth tones, such as green, brown and beige.

The BLHOA understands that the BLCC is presently donating sufficient funds for Phase 1 and the \$500.00, and anticipates transferring the Donated Funds for Phase 2, 3, and 4 during the 2008 calendar year, and the Donated Funds for Phase 5 during the 2009 calendar year.

The BLHOA in considering the acceptance of such gifts has performed the necessary due diligence and believes in its business judgment and in good faith that the installation of the Play Station is in the best interest of the neighborhood. As part of such due diligence, the BLHOA conducted a neighborhood survey. The majority of the residents participating in the survey voted in favor of installing the Play Station at the recreation center, for the BLHOA to maintain and insure the Play Station after it is installed, and for the BLHOA to maintain an appropriate capital reserve for a replacement play station.

Resolved

The BLHOA hereby accepts the Donated Funds, the Play Station and the \$500.00. The President of the BLHOA will immediately execute Phase 1 and will request Komp to begin the sprinkler preparation work, and will promptly remit the necessary portion of the Donated Funds and the \$500.00 together with the executed contract(s) to begin the work under Phase 1 and the sprinkler preparation work.

When the BLCC transfers the Donated Funds for Phases 2 through 5, it should state in writing which Phase such funds are to be used. If it does not, the BLHOA will request that the BLCC identify in writing the Phase for which such funds should be used. Upon receiving the Donated Funds to pay for such Phase(s), the BLHOA President will execute the corresponding contract(s) and will remit the necessary funds with the executed contract(s) within 30 days of receiving such Donated Funds. Such action will be taken without further vote of the BLHOA Board or the neighborhood.

Upon the installation of each Phase of the Play Station, the BLHOA will maintain the necessary insurance, repairs and upkeep of such Phase of the Play Station, as it does with the other neighborhood amenities such as the pool and the tennis courts. Additionally, the BLHOA will maintain the appropriate capital reserve.

NEW BUSINESS

No new business was raised for discussion. The next meeting of the Board of Directors will be the Annual Meeting of Members to be held at Wolfe Elementary and will be announced to homeowners via U.S. Mail. There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 5:15 p.m.

SECURITY UPDATE

A number of vehicle break-ins have occurred in an adjacent sub-division where entry was gained either through unlocked doors or by punching out the door locks. Laptops were the favorite target and one vehicle parked on the street was stolen. In addition, a vehicle with four males was parked in an alley in the same neighborhood at 11:30PM. The patrol service confronted them, and called HPD. The driver was arrested for possession of drugs and the vehicle was impounded. The disturbing part of this incident was the discovery of a uniform shirt with a name tag belonging to a security company. If the patrol service had not intervened, we can only imagine the scenario that could have evolved.
