THE VISION

The vision of the officers is coming to fruition: a Neighborhood Activity Center for the entire subdivision. When Clark Martinson of the Energy Corridor came to speak to us, we asked him of his vision for a neighborhood such as ours. The first idea that he responded with was to make the Recreation Center a hub for our neighborhood... a place of constant activity. That was his vision, and it is the vision of your officers. It will bond our neighborhood together in an ever changing society, and according to realtors it will add to the desirability of our neighborhood and help future property values. We have visited with so many of you about what you want for the neighborhood, and subsequently have made a tentative three to five year plan for the Community Club. We again will host what have become our traditional activities and give our donations as we always have. But there is more...



- YEAR One, Two Create a Neighborhood Activity Center for the entire subdivision.
- YEAR Three Plant trees where old ones have been removed or died.
- YEAR Four Redesign and Replant the Entry.



So, here we go. Year one is now- 2007, 2008. Here is the plan. The Activity Center will initially include proper ground cover and a “Play System” for Children ages 2-12. After the installation of the main structure, other equipment will be added, including two swings (one a baby swing) for the younger age group. For all age groups we would include a “Dip Station” for chin ups for adults and teens, and climbing for children, and a Balance Beam to help us all retain balance and avoid falls as we age. We will also have a bench swing for adults and families. The entire area will be wheelchair accessible for older adults and handicapped children. The picnic tables and benches are already in place. WOW! Let me say it again, WOW! What a FABULOUS SPACE for the entire neighborhood! We don’t have to increase our HOA dues, and all three neighborhoods will be a part of, and able to use, this project through the BLCC.



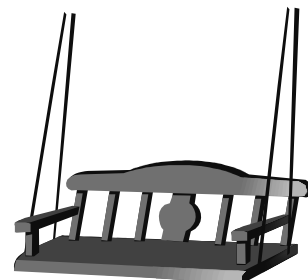
How do we pay for this? The Play System and the Free Form Surface Box and Hardwood Mulch cost \$14,629. We have approximately \$8,000 in our treasury (\$7,955.05), and if you donate the same amount of dues that you donated last year (\$5,500) we will have 13,455.05, which is \$1,174 short of what we need. Although last year’s actual operating expenses were less than \$1,650, we would still want to retain \$3,000 for the club to safely operate this year. Here is another way to look at the funds: We already have the \$3,000 to safely operate this year and the \$4,790 for the Freeform Surface Box and the Hardwood Mulch Cushion. Last year you donated \$5,500 and if we do that again we are approximately \$4,200 short for the purchase and installation of the Play System. Either way you look at it, we need \$4,200 more income this year than we had last year. That’s really not very much considering the results - a great space for the entire neighborhood to gather and increased property values when you are ready to sell your house! If we can’t raise it this year, then next year’s donations will cover the shortfall. (We would hate to wait a year for the main structure, but we could.)

Many residents have expressed an interest in donating more this year for a special project such as this. If all families donate this year, we will have no problem raising the extra \$4,200. Depending upon the response, we could have 2 units separated by age group, or a larger play system. Once

the main Play System is in place, we will then be able to add the other items to the Center through either business or family donations - in memory of or to honor a loved one. We have looked at play ground systems throughout the city, and most have small nameplates on individual items with a family name on it. What a great way to honor a resident or loved one who has moved or passed on!

Again, to accomplish our yearly goals, we will have our basic dues and levels of donation above and beyond basic membership. Just like last year, no one will know how much you give. It's up to you. (If you want to be an "Angel" and donate above and beyond your dues for a specific piece of equipment, please mark the form appropriately. You may donate part or all of the money for a specific piece and we will acknowledge all families that donate. You will receive a phone call about the personalization. You may also be an angel and donate anonymously. We are available by phone or email to answer any specific questions or to show you pictures of the equipment.)

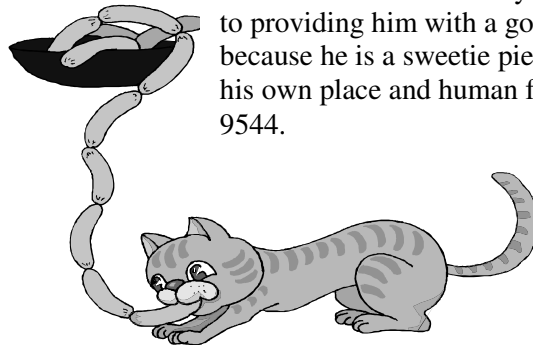

THE HISTORY OF BARKERS LANDING

Barkers Landing Subdivision began in 1972 under the name La Cour Du Roi (The King's Yard). It was to be a gated, single entry, private golf course

community with lion statuary guarding its entrance. The original developer encountered financial problems, and within a few years Hood Development Company had bought the property and changed the name to Barker's Landing On Memorial. Barker's Landing was built in sections between 1977 and 1989, first with townhouses, then patio homes, then full-size homes.

Barker's Landing comprises three subdivisions with a total of over 400 homes: Barker's Landing, Barker's Court, and Barker's Place. Each entity has its own homeowners' association. The three associations contribute on a pro-rata basis to maintain common areas and support shared services.

Planned Community Management Inc. (PCMI), located at 15995 North Barker's Landing Road, Suite 162, is the administrative agent for all three homeowners' associations.

The Barker's Landing Community Club (BLCC) is a social club for all residents. The BLCC sponsors social events (see listing on the last page), publishes this bimonthly bulletin, and uses its funds to help beautify the common areas. Each year it publishes a Barker's Landing Directory containing not only a listing of residents but also a wealth of useful information about the subdivision. Volunteers, including BLCC Block Captains, sustain all these neighborhood activities.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

June 21, 2007

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the Barkers Landing Homeowners Association, Inc. (BLHOA) was called at 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 21, 2007 at 15995 North Barkers Landing, Suite 162, Houston, Texas pursuant to the notice attached hereto as "Exhibit A".

Board members present were:

Guests in attendance included Charlie Burckle representing the ARC, Marjorie Bowstrom, President of the Barker Court HOA, Kim Barker, Nancy Denega and Liz Trapolino of Planned Community Management, Inc., as well as Charles Austin of JRD Construction, who is doing the concrete restoration program in the neighborhood.

A quorum being established, the meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m., with Don Fleck, President, presiding.

Concrete Restoration Program Report – Charles Austin

Mr. Austin reported that he has completed a large amount of the repairs he was contracted to do and, weather permitting, will complete the remainder in the next few weeks. He also notes that he has been approached for more work as the residents see his crews out working in the neighborhood. The Board did request that when replacing the areas with drains pipes, he try and use Schedule 40 pipe to ensure the drainage is effective and also asked that the excess pea gravel be removed. Mr. Austin assured the board that this will be done as the work is completed. Also, the Board requested that Mr. Austin and Ms. Walsh look at the esplanades to see what repairs are needed.

MINUTES

The first item on the agenda was the approval of the minutes from the previous meeting. **After discussion and upon a motion made, seconded and approved it was**

RESOLVED: to approve, as revised, the minutes of the BLHOA Board Meeting of May 17, 2007.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE (Suzanne Walsh)

Suzanne Walsh reported that an area of soil subsidence near the Recreation Center has been remedied by adding topsoil and sod in the affected area. The watering schedule has been altered from 3 days to a 5 day schedule to accommodate the warmer temperatures. Also, discussed was the recurring ant problem. A product was put down that should have been effective for 12 months, however some ants have returned. Ms. Walsh is looking into this.

There are two areas needing repair on the Barker Place wall segment before the Memorial wall will be repainted. Mr. Luthi and Ms. Walsh are working on this project as the repairs will be the responsibility of Barker Place HOA.

RECREATION CENTER (Ted Winzeler – Report Attached)

Ted Winzeler reported that the many items have been repaired this season. Attached is a list of the repaired and/or replaced items with pricing.

PATROL COMMITTEE (Noel Rando)

Noel Rando reported that there is one new officer in training and that the two officers, Zeppenfeldt and Montez, are working 24/7. Mr. Rando has investigated costs with other Security companies and thus far the current contractor seems to have the most favorable pricing.

Mr Rando reported several incidents in the neighborhood, one being a BB gun was used to shoot a hole in the window of a home on Fairport. The teen was located and the parents agreed to pay for the damages. Also, a visitor at a home on

Sandy Port left a suit and a pair of pants hanging in the back of an unlocked vehicle overnight and both items were missing in the morning.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE (Charlie Burckle)

Mr. Burckle reported routine activity in the community. He noted that he has spoken to the owner of the home painted an unapproved color and it will be repainted. Also, the owner who requested to change the fence height from 6 feet to 8 feet has withdrawn his request.

BP COMMITTEE (Charlie Burckle & Noel Rando – Report Attached)

Mr. Burckle and the Community Advisory Panel (CAP) will meet with Council member Toni Lawrence on Friday in a neutral location to discuss the community's concerns with the impact that BP is having on the area. At the meeting, the panel will discuss 1) The traffic study from the energy corridor that the panel does not feel is sound as this study was made in Spring and Fall 2006 before the completion of the parking lot; 2) The Panel has been told that some information was withheld from the report; 3) The reconfiguration (narrowing) of Grisby and the addition of a bike lane that keeps changing; 4) Information that per BP all is decided – residents are led to believe that the city is making the changes – not sure who decided; 5) Letter sent to BP was not responded to for 2 months and still will not address community.

A reporter from the Houston Chronicle is requesting information on the lack of response BP is giving the community. The committee will advise following meeting with Toni Lawrence.

BARKER'S LANDING COMMUNITY CLUB (Dottie Frank)

No Report

TREASURER'S REPORT – (Steven Shurn)

Mr. Shurn reviewed the financial reports enclosed with the meeting packet and agreed that they were acceptable and also reported that the idle funds have been put into CD's. Mr. Shurn also discussed the possibility of looking into different banks, such as having an ING account and using online payments and transfers. He felt that with ING's savings account, the association could receive a higher rate of return.

Also discussed was the Directors contact with delinquent account holders. All had excellent response with only a couple still outstanding, one to be paid the day of the meeting. Also, the Board requested that the owner of the vacant lots be sent a Final Demand Letter and if not paid, be turned over to our attorney for further action.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Board requested that Mr. Eaton write a letter to the City of Houston requesting the drainage issues in Barker's Landing be addressed by the City of Houston as the streets are not leveled to allow proper drainage. Many residents feel that this lack of leveling is the cause of the curb repairs they are now responsible for.

OLD BUSINESS

No old business covered.

NEW BUSINESS

No new business was raised for discussion. The next meeting of the Board of Directors was scheduled to take place at the office of Planned Community Management, Inc. on Thursday, August 16, 2007 at 3:00 pm. There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m.

The Community is Looking Better!

The Board would like to applaud the response to the Concrete Restoration Program undertaken in the community over the last few weeks. We have had over 54 homes take advantage of the pricing offered in the program; the contractor, JrD, has been appreciative of the comments from the owners. Our community is presenting a much prettier face to the world - the "curb appeal" is greatly enhanced.

The contractor has explained that he would not ordinarily be able to assemble a crew for the smaller jobs that have been undertaken at a cost less than \$1200 - \$1500 on a single-job basis. He has been able to do these jobs at the lower rates of \$450 - \$650 (for apron repair alone) only because he has been able to approach 5 - 10 homes at a time with the same crew.

The Board and the contractor understand that some of the residents have chosen to use other contractors for some of the work and that is perfectly acceptable; we are very pleased with the overall results.

For those of you that still need apron or drive repair, we strongly urge you to take advantage of the present program at its current low costs or to solicit these repairs from a contractor of your choice. We know that you are aware of your responsibility to maintain your home, fences and drives within the community. The Association has made its best effort to assist you to do so under a community-wide program. Routine inspections, later this fall, will make note of concrete areas still in need of repair.

SECURITY UPDATE GARAGE DOORS

However, it does take the homeowner time to complete the paper work and submit it to the proper location. In order to simplify the process we have improved the ARC web page by gathering all relative ARC information in one place and outlining a new plan using faxing. The new page can be found at www.Barkerslanding.org under the heading "Architectural". There you will find downloadable forms and instructions to make the process somewhat simpler. We are currently working on a way to use Email as an option to do the same thing but technical problems are not yet worked out. If you have an ARC request and have access to a fax machine, this is the way to go.
